### **Updated Liturgical directives**

**Masks** – Masks or face coverings are now optional at public liturgies but individuals that are unvaccinated should still wear masks.

**Social distancing** – Strick social distancing is no longer required in churches. An area in the back of church still will be specifically set aside with social distance seating and wearing masks for those who want to continue going that way.

**REMINDER:** Anyone (whether vaccinated or not) with a cough or fever, or who may otherwise be feeling sick, should **NOT** come to church for Mass.

**Confessions** will be on Saturday afternoons from **4:00-4:45pm**.

**Holy Hour** will be on **Thursday mornings after 7:30 am Mass**.
