## A CALL TO REPENTANCE

Today, we celebrate "The Word of God Sunday." In September of 2019, Pope Francis declared that "the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study, and dissemination of the Word of God." The Pope says that "A Day devoted to the Bible should not be seen as a yearly event but rather a year-long event, for we urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures."

The central message of this Sunday's readings reminds us that God wants all to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth. So, in our first reading Prophet Jonah was sent by God and compelled to go and preach to the people of Nineveh to save them from destruction. This is the same reason Jesus began His ministry with the reminder: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel." The urgency and importance of this message made Jesus go out to recruit more persons to help announce this good news to all peoples. The urgency of this message is more today than ever, St. Paul reminds us that "the time is running out" and because "the world in its present form is passing away" so, Jesus is calling each of us to come to Him and become a missionary disciple ready and willing to go and evangelize our brothers and sister and win them over to the kingdom of God. Are you ready to abandon some of your comfort, and securities and respond urgently to God's call to repentance and participate in calling others to repentance?
