I visited four Parishes and many of my Priest friends and classmates in the Seminary: St. Paul's Catholic Church, Phoenix, Arizona; St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church Sun City, Arizona; Sacred Heart Catholic Church, Parker, Arizona and St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, Las Vegas Nevada. It was so great meeting with many of my old friends and colleagues.

One of the important messages running through the three readings of this Sunday is a call to repentance, from all the wrong doings of the past done in ignorance, with an assurance that if we repent and are converted our sins will be wiped away. This requires that we become aware of our mistakes and wrong doings before Jesus Christ our Advocate with the Father, who is the expiation for our sins and that of the whole world, that we admit our frailty, repent, and be converted.
