THE PROPHETIC VOCATION OF ALL THE BAPTIZED

A prophet is someone called and chosen by God. He may not be perfect, or a person endowed with special or mysterious powers. His authority to speak does not come from his extraordinary abilities but rather from God who has called and chosen him to be His spokesperson. A prophet is called by God to accomplish a specific mission, he is sent to a people who might not be well disposed to listen, and accept his messages; or to persons who might be hostile and rebellious to his message but whether they listen or not the prophet must continue to be a strong and courageous voice and sign of God's presence among the people he is sent to prophesy. The duty of a prophet is to be God's mouthpiece and to lead and direct God's people to live by God's commands. Our first reading presents to us the call of Ezekiel, six hundred years before the coming of Christ. He prophesied before, during and after the Babylonians destroyed Jerusalem. His duty was to warn the people of the coming destruction if they refused to heed God's warning and repent. God warned Ezekiel that his task would not be easy, this passage prepares us for the cold reception that Jesus himself received in the Gospel of this Sunday in his hometown of Nazareth, this will serve as a forewarning to all prophets that the work of a prophet is never going to be an easy one. Hence the need to totally depend on God's ever sufficient grace and mercy and not on human capabilities.
