WHO IS THE GREATEST? 25th Yr. 2024

Most people view greatness in relation to positions that one occupies in society or the credentials that one has acquired, the apostles of Christ were not different. Jesus announced to of them his approaching suffering, death, and resurrection but they did not understand and were more concerned with the question of who was the greatest. Jesus disagrees with the worldly notions of greatness and invites his apostles and all of us to see greatness as an invitation to serve others, particularly the poor and most the vulnerable among us. The kingdom that Christ came to establish is not about seeking honor and glory for oneself, but that of service to others. St James examines the root causes of discord between persons and within communities, and points to the uncontrolled quest, selfish ambitions, jealousy, and envy as the root cause of disharmony, he recommends that we should embrace the wisdom that comes down from above which places others first and self-last. To answer the question who is the greatest Jesus says "If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all" and to help his apostles and us understand clearly His teaching on this issue Jesus takes a child and set him among them and says "whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me" By giving us a child as a model, Jesus wants us to understand that we must place those who do not count, the marginalized, and the poorest at the center of our concern. May we see greatness in terms of serving others after the example of Christ who came not to be served but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many.
