

JESUS IS OUR LIGHT

Jesus began His public ministry in Galilee in the region of Zebulun and Naphtali among the despised and abandoned Gentile people; those who needed a Savior most. St. Matthew sees this as the fulfillment of the prophecy of Isaiah: “The people who sit in darkness have seen a great light, on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death, light has arisen” Jesus is the light that has come to dispel the darkness that has cast a gloom on our world. It is strange that after more than two thousand years after the birth, suffering, death, and resurrection of Christ our world still fumbles in darkness. There are many notable works of darkness in our world today; we hear and watch sad news of the effects of hatred, malice and violence from every corner of our world, we also experience the darkness of oppression, despair, loneliness, and fear.

The reason evil continues to reign supreme in our world is because many of us have refused to accept the Savior born for us, the light sent to drive away our darkness. As St. John said: “He came to His own people, they did not accept Him but to those who did accept Him He gave power to become children of God” Jn.1:11-12. Jesus continues to call all of us to conversion and repentance. To be the light that dispels every work of darkness in our life, families and within our Church communities. He continues to invite and recruit new disciples to spread His light of love and mercy wherever darkness is found, may we respond promptly and generously like Andrew, Peter, James and John who “immediately left everything and followed Him.”

P.S. Today, we celebrate “**The Word of God Sunday.**” In September of 2019, Pope Francis declared that “the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time each year is to be devoted to the celebration, study, and dissemination of the Word of God.” The Pope says that “A Day devoted to the Bible should not be seen as a yearly event but rather a year-long event, for we urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures.”


Encounter Youth Group for all 6th and 7th grade students on Saturday, February 7th from 3:00 – 4:30 pm in the old school building.


